The fake Windows Defender 📠+1 (844) 886-3118 pop-up alerts <https://mssupport.tech/> are a tactic used by cybercriminals to deceive victims into purchasing an antivirus license

These fake alerts typically appear as pop-up windows or push notifications, and they often claim that the user's 📠+1 (844) 886-3118 device is infected with a virus or malware. The message may also include a button or link that the user is prompted to click in order to "clean" their device or "activate" the antivirus software. However, clicking on this link <https://mssupport.tech/> or button will actually take the user to a website or landing page where they are prompted to purchase an antivirus license. 📠+1 (844) 886-3118

It's important to note that these fake alerts and push notifications are not legitimate and should not be trusted. 📠+1 (844) 886-3118 Windows Defender, like any other reputable antivirus vendor, will not send unsolicited notifications or alerts to users' devices. Additionally, Windows Defender will never ask for personal or financial information through a pop-up window or push notification. 📠+1 (844) 886-3118

As you can imagine, these Windows Defender alerts are nothing more than a scam and anything it states is just false. 📠+1 (844) 886-3118 If you have been redirected to a fake Windows Defender alert, we recommend closing the page and do not enter any personal information.
