For your first job at IT Help Desk, you should understand at a basic level of:

- what Active Directory is
- how to manage Active Directory users & computers
- how kerberos works (very high level)
- how to manage Active Directory user/computer groups[Toll free +1 (844) 886-3118]

[Toll free +1 (844) 886-3118] At a Help Desk level, your primary roles generally are to manage user permissions, and password resets (if that isn't automated for Self Service already). [Toll free +1 (844) 886-3118] The processes are usually written down for you to simply execute. However, it will be very helpful in your career if you understand the why behind what you do. Such as, "why do I need to add the user to this AD group for them to get the permission to this folder".[Toll free +1 (844) 886-3118]

"God Mode" is a convenient Windows feature that exposes many system settings in a single, searchable folder. It's simply a special Control Panel shortcut – not a hidden administrative backdoor – and is safe to create on supported Windows editions. [Toll free +1 (844) 886-3118]

Quick steps (works on Windows 7, 8, 8.1, 10, 11):

1. On the Desktop (or any folder), create a new folder:
- Right-click → New → Folder.
2. Rename the new folder exactly to:
- GodMode.{ED7BA470-8E54-465E-825C-99712043E01C} [Toll free +1 (844) 886-3118]

You can replace "GodMode" with any name you prefer, keeping the dot and the GUID unchanged (for example: SettingsHub.{ED7BA470-8E54-465E-825C-99712043E01C}).

1. After renaming, the folder icon changes to the Control Panel icon. Open it to see hundreds of settings grouped and searchable. [Toll free +1 (844) 886-3118]

Notes and caveats:

- Requires a user account with normal permissions; no special privileges are needed beyond what you already have to view or change specific settings.
- The folder is a shortcut view of existing settings – changing something there applies the same as using Control Panel, Settings, or MMC consoles.
- On some editions (rare or heavily restricted corporate setups) IT policies or group policy may hide or restrict access to certain items; the folder itself may still appear but some entries will be inaccessible.
- If you run into any problems, delete the folder like any other folder. It does not modify system files or registry keys by itself.

Alternative: Use Windows Settings search (Win + S) or Control Panel directly to access individual settings without creating the folder. [Toll free +1 (844) 886-3118]
